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Round B Mock Interviews Workshop

The B-round Mock Interview workshop, hosted by Drexel SWE on Wednesday, February 5th, from 5:00 pm - 7:00 pm, provided an opportunity for our members to receive assistance and feedback on how to adequately prepare for their upcoming co-op interviews. Present were three co-op coordinators from the SCDC as well as two professionals with work experiences at Merck. This event allowed for one on one mock interview sessions with the SWE members that were present. From my personal experience as well as that of the members, this workshop cleared many doubts and allowed for increased practice with interviewing skills. It enabled the students to build their confidence in interviewing with competitive employers, and equipped them with the skills and tactics needed to tackle those tough interview questions as well. The workshop also provided resume review assistance from the interviewers as well as the SWE board members who have had significant previous work experiences. Attendees were able to receive direct constructive criticism on improving the content and layout of their resumes, as well as ways to articulate the material on their resumes into their interviews. Mock interview workshops such as this are one of the most instrumental resources to help students prepare in the best possible way for their upcoming job interviews. And we hope that in the future, students continue to utilize the opportunities to advance their professional development.




Personality Assessment Seminar

As one of the many membership events this term, Drexel SWE held a two-part Personality Assessment Seminar, which focused on discovering and introducing members to what their personality type or psychological type were, based on the actual Myers and Briggs model of personality development, and then gaining the knowledge to be able to effectively apply their specific personality type traits to benefit them in a professional setting. The first session of the seminar consisted of a self-scoring Style Inventory that would enable the members to individually identify what relatable characteristics suited them the most, which in turn resulted in being aware of their specific personality type. The second session of the seminar was a continuation of the first, as the members reflected on their newly discovered personality types and learned how to apply them to any professional endeavors they may have. It was a very interactive session, as there were opportunities for our fellow Drexel SWE leaders to share their co-op stories, as well as any tips or experiences they thought were useful for the other members. There was also a small, team-building exercise that the members partook in that allowed for the extrovert types and introvert types to work together in solving an issue. The purpose of this seminar was to not only strengthen the members' understanding of WHO they are as individuals, but to give them a better idea as to what kind of professional and social environment is best suited to fit them! Overall, it was a successful event that opened many members' eyes and proved to be an interesting experience since many had not realized what type they were to begin with. It was also interesting to have been able to find out the personality types of the other members and learning how to work well with each of them. This was the first self assessment type event that Drexel SWE has done, and hopefully there will be more to come!
